Tell the Wyoming Oil & Gas Commission to Increase Setbacks, Reduce Flaring, and Require Better Bonding!

Partly in response to a rulemaking petition submitted by our organization and our allies, the Wyoming Oil and Gas Commission is about to embark on a major revision of its rules to address three main concerns: 1) flaring; 2) bonding; and 3) setbacks from homes and schools.

The Commission staff, along with the Governor's staff, will be hosting a public meeting on the proposed rulemaking. The Commission will outline current regulatory requirements, give an overview of what other states are doing, and outline the basic ideas for their proposed rules. While not a formal public comment period, the meeting is a good opportunity to send the message to the Commission that the rules must be strong and adequately protect Wyoming's people and our quality of life.
