(WPR)</b> - Drilling for gas in the Fortification Creek elk range of northeast Wyoming is expected to start by the end of August after federal land managers ruled the drilling would have no significant environmental impact.</p> <p>Anadarko Petroleum told the Gillette News-Record in an e-mail it is moving ahead with plans to start drilling 134 wells in the area northwest of Gillette.</p> <p>The Bureau of Land Management said last month the drilling wouldn't have a significant environmental impact. Some conservation and hunting groups have raised concerns about the effects on elk.</p> <p>Wyoming Wildlife Federation spokesman Mark Winland says the BLM didn't adequately address those issues.
